

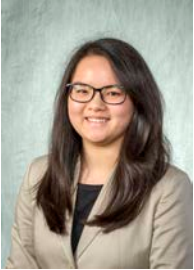


Park Scholarships

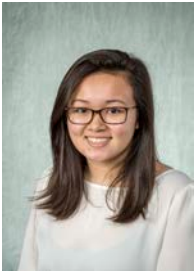
